



Today's Word: Section of Focus



Section of Focus	Description
Art and the environme nt	This section of focus recognises the importance of the environment to artists and how it can be a primary source for inspiration and use as a medium in its own right. It also acknowledges that students are surrounded by their own local environment, which can be a source of inspiration. Art and the environment includes a range of artistic practices encompassing both historical depictions and traditional approaches to nature in art. More recent developments have seen environmental artwork that addresses social and political issues, which can include the use of the environment itself as the medium and/or the message. How an artist uses or responds to an environment reflects how they are often sensitive to questions such as the preservation of built heritage, cultural lives of people in the community, ecology and nature, etc. and recognise its importance to themes of identity. Using the Visual Studies Framework, the environment can be explored as a resource which sees artists often elaborate on the unique characteristics peculiar to that environment and enhance or comment on it in some way. Architecture, Land Art and the landscape itself, Street Art, Public Art, Environmental Design, urban/rural design, issues and ideas around Education for Sustainable Development, Consumer/Product Design, Interior Design, and even Online Environments are among many of the rich sources for visual research and study in this section of focus.
