To encourage engagement pair students to review the content from the choice board. Class discussion based on the choice board to clarify misconceptions and reinforce understanding. Pre-question: Identify the types of agriculture in the different Pays of the Paris Basin Choice board Paris Basin Choice Board	Use the information from the Exit Ticket to reinforce learning/ clarify misconceptions. Engage in effective questioning techniques Guided discussion on how the physical characteristics in the Paris Basin makes it a distinct core economic region.	Students will add to their mindmaps the physical characteristics of the Paris Basin Students will choose one activity from the homework choice board to reinforce learning from the class
Fri	Evaluate how the physical characteristics in the Paris Basin makes it a distinct core economic region.	Identify the key terminology needed to complete a 30-mark essay on the Development of Primary Economic Activities in the Paris Basin	Group work: students compare key terminology in groups and add to their list. In pairs develop the Significant Relevant Points (SRPs) for the proposed essay. Students to add their SRPs to a Padlet wall Teacher reviews Padlet, clarifies misconceptions and consolidates learning.
